## 2. Weather and Occupancy Status in Main Tourism Zones:

Negombo	The weather in Negombo is currently sunny, with calm seas. The area from	
	Wennappuwa to Marawila continues to experience low occupancy. However,	
	occupancy within the Negombo city area remains strong, and the electricity supply	
	there is stable. Several hotels report minor property damage. The Negombo hotel belt	
	is operating with good occupancy despite the effects of the weather. Most main roads	
	have now been cleared, and travel is generally safe.	
Kalutara	The weather is sunny, and the sea remains slightly rough. Overall occupancy remains	
	strong at 75% in Kalutara hotels. No damage to any hotel or any other restrictions.	
Passikudah	The weather in Passikudah is sunny, with slightly rough sea. Overall regional hotel	
	occupancy is low. Electricity supply is stable. A few hotels have reported minor	
	property damage. Despite this, all beachfront properties are fully in operation.	
Hikkaduwa	The weather in Hikkaduwa is sunny though the seas remain slightly rough.	
	Overall occupancy remains strong at 70%.	
	Electricity and pipe-borne water supply remain stable without disruptions.	
Bentota/	All hotels are operating at a robust capacity, maintaining occupancy levels between	
Beruwela	75% and 85%. The sector continues to function normally.	
Ella	The situation remains under control, with normal conditions prevailing across the	
	area. Access via the Wellawaya route is fully possible, and no reported incidents.

2. Full Coastal Line train operations will be restored to normal schedule starting the day after

tomorrow.

3. Scheduled train services on the Main Line are currently operating between Colombo and

Mirigama.
